

# **BIDDING PRAYER**


The Good Friday bidding prayer is one of the church's oldest prayers in continuous use. It is called a bidding prayer because of its structure. After each bid or invitation to prayer, the assembly prays silently. The presider

concludes each bid saying, "We ask this through Christ our Lord" and the assembly responds: **Amen.**
