

Dear friends, family, and partners in mission,

We are now firmly in the trenches of Holy Week. We remember the suffering even as we remember the glory of resurrection. We live redeemed by Jesus' sacrifice and even as we are compelled to come to the cross for forgiveness. We are baptized to new life through Jesus' death. Such contradictions, and yet such a singular focus.

My prayer is that the Holy Spirit bring your Holy Week a hope in the resurrection of our King, even as you remember the sacrifice, and that you may live and remember the fullness of God's promise for our eternity with Him.

Attached is just a short newsletter, marking this season of spring.

Happy New Year!

Well, sort of. In Japan, the new academic year of school, the new fiscal year, the time for changing jobs, the time for all things new occurs on April 1st. We started our new academic year a few days ago and are welcoming in about 170 new students. With slightly relaxed mask requirements, it has been nice to see some faces of students and faculty for the first time, even if we may have met three years ago!

Early April generally coincides with tree blossoms in full bloom, so it is particularly easy to correlate the freshness that occurs within God's creation to the newness and transformations in life. Cherry trees, plum trees, magnolia, wisteria, and a myriad of other treasures. As Patrick and I look ahead to this new year, we continue to be grateful for God's provision and His mercy.

March 1st marked the beginning of our 18th year on

this assignment in Japan. What began as a four-year commitment has stretched into al-

most two decades. When that much time passes, one can imagine how many unexpected things have crossed our paths. We did not expect to raise our kids here. We did not expect to make such deep, lasting friendships. We did not

expect to say goodbye to my mother here or lose so many good friends, either due to their departure from Japan or their departure to their heavenly life. We did not expect to miss almost every Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, birthday, family reunion, baby shower, retirement celebration, and funeral with our families and friends. Instead, we expected that in around 2010, we would return to the U.S., probably the Midwest, with our (one at that time) daughter and return to public school teaching. But, as we read in Romans 8:28, "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his

purpose." The word "good" cannot be mistaken for the word "ease." What is good is not always easy. In fact, it usually is not.

When we gather together as a Church this Sunday to celebrate the resurrection of our King, I pray that all gatherings will be blessed, even if they aren't easy. Even if those gatherings are missing some key people. Even if the ham gets burnt. Even if things don't go as expected. I imagine that Mary, at the tomb of Jesus, did not expect an angel to appear, or the ground to shake beneath their feet, or to find the stone rolled away. In fact, those things may have made her tremble at the time as she tried to discern what to do next. She couldn't have known what much bigger things God had in store for her and for the world, and that those expectations would soon give way to a new path toward eternal life.




