





Lutheran World Relief Kits

School is just barely out for the summer, and we want you to start thinking about getting in on BACK TO SCHOOL SALES!

The CLCW is thinking ahead about all the kits that will be put together for shipment to Lutheran World Relief in October.

Did you ever wonder what it would be like to go to school without pencils or paper or crayons? The items being collected for **School Kits** this year include the following:

- 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10-1/2"; no loose-leaf paper.
- 30-centimeter rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other.
- Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers.
- Black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink).
- Blunt pairs of scissors.
- Boxes of 16 or 24 crayons.

Please note that we already have plenty of pencil sharpeners and erasers for School Kits this year.

We are collecting only the following items for **Baby Care Kits** this year:

- Lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies®).
- Long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet).
- Receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square.
- Cloth diapers, flat fold preferred (diapers must be new).
- Jackets, sweaters or sweatshirts with hoods, or include a baby cap.
- Socks.
- Hand towels, dark color recommended (towels must be new).
- Bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping (soap must be new).
- Diaper pins or large safety pins.

We are collecting only the following items for **Personal Care Kits** this year:

- Adult-size toothbrushes in original packaging.
- Bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping.
- Sturdy combs.
